# WE'RE DESPERATE FOR FOSTER FAMILIES!


#### Here's what fosters, Alyssa and David, say about fostering:

# The PERILS of ICE

Most Goldens love the lake! Whether you visit the cottage year-round or have a home near the water, the beauty of the lake in the summer is spectacular. And while there are some inherent risks at any time of year, the presence of ice in the winter holds unique challenges for both humans and Goldens alike.

Being aware of those risks is one way to ensure your Golden can continue their love of the water and enjoy it for many years to come. There are many dangers with any body of water.

Thin ice can crop up in patches anywhere on a surface. Just because it's cold outside doesn't mean that ice is strong enough to hold you or your dog. A BASIC GUIDELINE FOR ICE SAFETY IS THAT THE ICE SHOULD BE AT LEAST FIVE INCHES THICK. On the whole, thicker ice is always better. Double those requirements if the ice is covered by snow. Believe it or not, snow can act as an insulator for ice. It may actually make the ice warmer and weaker. Often the weakest ice will be in the center and along the edges. Snow is also heavy, so it adds extra stress on developing ice.

While falling through ice is never a good experience, shelf ice typically prevents one's exit.


We know that every year there are pets who don't survive the lake experience in the cold months. This is not meant to alarm anyone but serve as a cautionary note for those who find themselves in proximity to ice in the winter.

Most dogs love routine and a Golden is no exception. Consider, before ice forms, altering your dog's regular walking routine in the opposite direction of a body of water (lakes, ponds, rivers). Once the ice has melted in the spring, you can once again make water features part of your dog's exercise and walk regime.

### **Jenny #1828**

Eleven years ago, Jenny #1828 arrived in our home for foster care. It quickly became apparent that she was to be a foster failure and joined our Golden family with two senior Golden boys, Murphy and Bentley #1664. The boys were quite happy that they had a mother hen to watch over them. Although Jenny was much smaller than either of them, she let them know in no uncertain terms that she would get her share of stuffies and that wrestling was not exclusive to just boys!

When we read last month's Guardian article about the loss of a pet, we were painfully reminded about how loss affects not only humans, but the remaining pets in the home. We had Jenny for just two years when we lost both of her fur brothers within three weeks of each other. Our happy, carefree girl became withdrawn and lethargic. Yes, animals grieve too. We had other fosters come through our home, but it was not until Snowy #2170 arrived (another foster failure) that Jenny returned to life and was able to be the mother hen once again. A few years later, Hunter #2897 showed up for foster care, and you guessed it, never left. Jenny is now 16 years old ~ she just celebrated her birthday. She is totally deaf, moves a little slower, snores a lot louder, and while she does not jump in and wrestle as much, she still supervises Snowy and Hunter to make sure they are playing nicely. Always the mother hen!

# **CFIA BAN UPDATE:**

### **Uniting for Change!**

Here is the latest on our battle against the CFIA Ban and how we are taking the fight to the next level.

#### **Advocacy in Action**

The CFIA might have hoped we'd back down, but they underestimated our determination! Our team has launched a powerful campaign, reaching out to Members of Parliament with clear demands, actionable steps, and non-negotiable outcomes. We will continue to apply pressure until the necessary changes are made!

#### **Rescuing Goldens, Near and Far**

It is crucial to reiterate that saving every Golden possible in Canada remains our top priority. In fact, we ensure that all shelters are aware of our readiness to assist all Goldens in need (with the exception of aggressive repeat biters). However, in recognizing our global interconnectedness, coupled with available adopters and resources, we firmly advocate for extending our reach beyond borders. Every Golden in the world deserves a life free from suffering. We uphold rigorous adoption standards, ensuring we never contribute to shelter overpopulation! All Golden Rescue adopters are legally bound to return the Golden to us if unable to provide care. This commitment safeguards against any potential strain on shelters, reinforcing our dedication to responsible rescue practices.

#### **Rallying for Change**

Exciting plans are underway as we enter the early stages of organizing rallies to advocate to amend the ban. Vancouver, Ottawa, and potentially Toronto are our targeted locations, aiming to capture substantial media interest. When the time comes, most likely in the spring, we urge all supporters to stand with us, alongside with your beautiful Goldens (be they international, domestic or non-rescues) to amplify our voices and unite for change!

Thank you for your unyielding support. It's not just appreciated...it's essential! Let's keep pushing forward, stronger and louder than ever.




