LOOKING BACK ~ A YEAR IN REVIEW...

2013 was a busy and fruitful year for Golden Rescue. We rescued 164 dogs and at press time we have added another 25 dogs to the program. Fortunately, this year most of our dogs came to us without tragic stories...but of course some came with heart-breaking histories.

HERE ARE A FEW FACTS:

Out of the 164 dogs we rescued, nine were strays, two arrived with epilepsy, three were described by vets as emaciated, four needed immediate surgery, 17 required medication or medical attention for everything from flea infestation, to kidney disease, to allergies to heartworm. Some, unfortunately, were too far gone to help and there were seven Goldens we weren't able to save, or they crossed the Rainbow Bridge while in foster care. Everyone on the operations team, from intakes, transports, fosters, general inquiries, to placements had their hands full this year. There were some sad stories and some difficult moments, but it ended up being a very rewarding year. We would like to thank all our foster homes and volunteers in ops... we couldn't have done it without you!

We developed a number of new initiatives

in 2013 like an Adoption Guide. This is a substantial document that gives new adopters a blueprint for success when adopting a Golden. We also finalized a foster agreement that sets out the terms of fostering and describes the relationship between Golden Rescue and the foster family and also includes an updated Foster Guide.

The Board of Directors has established an advisory committee for important and sensitive issues such as:

- euthanasia
- potentially litigious issues
- dog bites
- vet care in excess of \$5,000
- removal of a dog from a foster or adopter

Our new website, which has made a significant difference to our ability to communicate with the public, was designed by an agency based in London and Toronto called Arcane and we hope you'll all agree that it's a fabulous website. This was also the year we converted all of our potential adoption stories to narratives from a Golden's point of view. This shift has improved our website visibility and we have been getting significantly more adoption applications. Adoption e-blasts have been going out each week...also a new initiative.

Our second annual Wishbone Lottery was a success. We sold 254 more tickets this year over last and we netted, after all expenses, over \$100,000. We are so proud that this will all go to our Goldens. Hurrah!!! And it's all thanks to you! **Our picnic** was the best attended yet and through sponsorships, general store sales, and the silent auction, it has become our second biggest fundraiser, as well as being a great fun day for our supporters and their Goldens.

Treasury also had a busy year. Canada Revenue decided to audit us this year and, as a result, requires us to develop new techniques, particularly as it relates to 'gifts' in kind'. In a nutshell, we have to engage in a cheque exchange system with our supporting vets in order to reap the benefits of the various discount programs that our supporting vets are currently participating in. This requires a significant amount of administrative support, so to assist us in this transition, we have purchased a donation software package and are in the process of contacting all of our vets to discuss this new process. We are now set up for electronic funds transfer for the convenience of all those donating to GR and by March 1st, we will also be able to accept Visa debit cards. We are also pleased to report that Golden Rescue is in good financial shape.

The events team had over 400 volunteers and 375 Golden ambassadors help with a busy program this year and they would like to thank everyone for their efforts. We participated in 18 events in a variety of locations. Our focus was to find venues that gave the highest awareness for GR. This year, we expanded our reach with the help of LCBO Tag Days, which was a very successful program. We set up at 23 locations and not only did we raise over \$12,500, we also raised GR's awareness significantly in those various communities/neighbourhoods.

Our social media team was busy as we really concentrated on our social media venues this year and on keeping them current and interesting:

Facebook ~ we currently have 2,717 followers and are gaining approximately 75-100 followers a week. Depending on the content posted, we reach 12-50K daily for our regular posts. The most 'shared' and 'liked' posts are lost dog posters, adoption alerts, updates on our dogs in foster, and generic, heartwarming second chance stories. A note from our team ~ it's great that you 'like' our posts but our greatest exposure is when you 'share' them.

Twitter ~ we have increased our followers from 670 to 1,981 (adding younger followers too) and we have had over 1,600 tweets since we started. The most 'retweeted' posts are lost dogs, #WednesdaysWags, adoption alerts, 'adopted' tweets, and birthday celebrations.

Pinterest ~ we started with 50 followers and we now have 897 with 20 boards and 1,215 pins at time of writing.

Our 'animal advocates' also continue to increase awareness of causes that will promote animal welfare in our communities. These initiatives have included letters to MPPs to encourage legislature that will aim to end puppy mills and create stronger standards for animal ownership, gaining support for petitions in Canada and the US seeking the ban of advertisements for the sale of animals on classified sites, and speaking with councillors and law enforcers to recommend changes to existing bylaws to prevent animal cruelty issues. While there are seemingly an endless number of deserving initiatives to give our voice to, we are committed to gradually making indelible changes to animal welfare in our communities...one dog at a time.

The University of Guelph Institute for Comparative Cancer Investigation (ICCI)

has developed a unique resource that provides access to clinical specimens from naturally occurring cancers to the scientific community: The Companion Animal Tumour Sample Bank (CATSB). These samples include blood, urine, and tissue samples that can be utilized by researchers investigating the causes and cures of cancers that occur in pets. Allandale Veterinary Hospital and Golden Rescue are starting a pilot program to aid the quest for samples. Blood samples will be provided from dogs that have a diagnosed tumor. Samples must be handled in a very specific way, so we are starting with this one clinic with the hopes that it can become a broader program in the future. If this is not your clinic, but you would like to contribute samples, you may contact Dr. Patricia Lechten at patricia.lechten@sympatico.ca.

We started working on revising our corporate

documents, including our by-laws, and changing our letters patent to articles of incorporation, after our last annual general meeting. We were incorporating various updates when the legislation for not-for-profit organizations changed. This new legislation effected this work, which we stopped until the new requirements were better understood. In addition, earlier last year the CRA did an audit that required further by-law changes. We have almost completed this work and hope to post our new by-laws on our website in the next few months.

All of us work together to give deserving Goldens the opportunity to find their forever families and a life filled with love and care. This is a testament to our compassion and belief in a better world for our Goldens who have no voice. "Some people talk to animals. Not many listen though. That's the problem." A.A. Milne, Winnie-the-Pooh. We thank all of you who do listen!

Volunteer Coordinators




