Hello dear Golden lovers! It's December and Christmas is approaching ~ a joyous time of year when we celebrate with family and friends. We are part of your family and, on a personal note, we want to enjoy the holidays as much as you do. Like small children, we are curious, so please 'puppy-proof' your home. This means keeping us safe when Christmas decorations come out of storage, Christmas trees are put up, and extra food is set out. We love to explore and many of these things can be a danger to us. So in the spirit of Christmas, I've chosen a lot of your more 'seasonal' questions.

Dear Goldie: What should I look out for at Christmas to ensure my Golden is safe and doesn't get into anything that might hurt him? Nervous Noel

Dear Nervous Noel: Where do I start? Christmas is a wonderful time of year and I love it but please make sure we're all happy and safe. Oddly, things like adhesives and glue on Christmas presents can be a problem, particularly glue. Glue is toxic to dogs so try and avoid using it completely. To make matters worse, glue smells attract us so keep it out of reach or better yet, don't use it at all. Ribbons, yarn, and string can also be a problem if we ingest them. They have been known to get wrapped around the intestine potentially causing a need for a serious operation. If your Golden is curious like me, keep all your presents out of reach. Lit candles within tail wagging reach, can be really dangerous. Berries and leaves from holly can cause discomfort and vomiting if eaten but poinsettias are even worse and can cause blistering in the mouth within seconds as well as stomach disorders. Even mistletoe should be kept out of reach. Good grief, I'm making it sound like Christmas is full of land mines. So, let's move to the Christmas tree. Some dogs will actually 'mark' the tree. I would never do something like that, but unfortunately some Goldens will. It has also happened that a dog will knock the tree over if the stand isn't totally secure. There are even some Goldens who have tried to eat the Christmas tree lights wire...now that one takes the cake but it has happened. Some people add a preservative to the water that keeps the tree fresh. That's also a big no-no for dogs. Just make sure there's lots of water around so your Golden isn't tempted to go under the tree for a drink. Finally, there can be a lot of extra garbage. Please make sure it is

always out of our reach, especially things like string and turkey bones. Having said all of this, Christmas is my absolute favourite time of year. I love all the decorations, all the company, all the great food smells, all my presents, and especially all the good will ~ people are so kind, loving, generous, and happy. In fact, so much so it makes me wonder if it wasn't a Golden who invented Christmas in the first place! (teehee)

Dear Goldie: Last year at Christmas, a big fat guy in a red suit came into our living room at three o'clock in the morning. Our Golden went crazy and woke up the whole neighbourhood. It turned out to be Santa Claus. What can we do in the future to have our Golden understand that it's okay when Santa visits? Sleepless Sarah

Dear Sarah: Yes, this is a common problem. There is no real solution because we Goldens are naturally protective of our homes. The thing you could try is to leave a note for Santa beside his cookies and milk that reads, "Please share with our Golden". That way we might just wait quietly for the big fella to arrive. Make sure the cookies are dog friendly though.:)

Dear Goldie: My Golden is constantly limping in the winter when he comes back from his walks on a snowy, cold winter's day. Booties don't work as he just rips them off. What can I do? Winnie

Dear Winnie: There are three reasons your Golden might limp in the winter: (1) He has snow caught between his toes. (2) It is too cold outside and his paws are freezing. (3) Salt.

The first one is easy. As you are out on your walk, stop periodically to clear the snow between his toes. He will likely do this

himself but you can help. Two ~ if it's that cold, make your walks much shorter. There are ways to give them exercise inside your home. You can also periodically warm up our paws with your hands. Three ~ salt! This is a bad one as salt can actually eat into our paws. Take a cloth with you and wipe our pads as best you can. Better still, try to avoid any roadway or sidewalk that has been salted. When you get home wash the paws immediately.

Dear Goldie: I have been told it is okay to give dogs turkey bones as long as they're the bigger ones like the leg. Is that true? George

Dear George: Absolutely not! It is very dangerous to give your dog any bone from a turkey or chicken. In fact, most bones can be problematic except for knuckle or marrow bones. Turkey bones are soft and can break off in shards very easily.


Dear Goldie: My Golden slipped on our deck this morning when I first let him out and he strained his leg badly. What can I do to avoid this in the future? Doug

Dear Doug: This is a common winter problem and needs to be watched carefully. Once your deck ices up, it becomes a dangerous surface. There are dog-safe ice melting products out there but read the label carefully to make sure that's the case. The best solution is to try and let your Golden out another way. If this isn't possible, try to curb his enthusiasm by taking him out on the leash over the deck. If he goes out cautiously, all should go well.





Tag Days are great for building awareness and our beautiful and friendly Goldens draw people like magnets, many of whom are really interested in hearing about the work we do. Apart from awareness, these events raise significant funds. Our donations range between \$600 and \$1,100 per location and we raised almost \$20,000 this year and are hoping to increase this amount to \$30,000 in 2017. We have also noticed a bump in adoption and foster applications after each Tag Day.

Most of our volunteers report that they really enjoy the interaction with the public and of course, our Goldens love all the attention, petting, and treats. 


Dog Tales Festival ~ a tail-waggingly spectacular event!


