Come To Me My Canine Angel

Although I have never read Nikolai Gogol's 1842 novel 'Dead Souls', the title has always haunted me, recently it was my experience. In late June, we had to put down our Golden Retriever, Sophie, three months before her 13th birthday. Sophie had gone from vigorous health to fatally ill within two weeks ~ the cause a rampaging cancer in her muzzle and, suddenly, she was gone. I had been through the horror of putting down a dog before so I cannot claim naivety about just how awful this process is. Perhaps no dog owner ever realizes in advance how intimately his life has become entwined with his dog. But I discovered that my life had no purpose without Sophie.

Some people who meant to extend kindly sympathy said, "It's like a death in the family". But it's not, you know! It's worse! There are (at least, remote) family members whose death I could have countenanced with greater equanimity.

In the two months after Sophie's death, I became one of Gogol's dead souls. That is to say, I went through the motions of daily living but inside I had withered up and died. There was an aching, painful void. Whereas formerly, amidst the ups and downs and the inevitable vicissitudes of life, I had been able to maintain a basic conviction that life is good.

Now, chastising me for melodrama or hyperbole is pointless. I am not proud that my faith in the goodness of life should be so ephemeral as to be shattered by the death of a dog but that is the reality. I just did not want to go on living. Of course, I could tell myself (and did, frequently) that I was being ridiculous, that Sophie had had a wonderful life, that other people have courageously faced down greater tragedies ~ the death of a spouse or, God forbid, a child ~ I told myself such things over and over but nothing changed. Perhaps the bond between dog and man extends so far back in evolutionary history as to be in a realm beyond reason.

Of course, many people said that the only way out is to get another dog. But I didn't want another dog...I wanted Sophie back. My wife and I decided that we would wait a year ~ well six months anyway ~ before even considering another dog. We told each other all the new things we would do now that we weren't 'tied down'. The trouble was that, without Sophie, we had no zest for things new or old. We longed to be tied down again.

But there is also the question of age. I have had my biblically allotted 'three score years and ten', and my wife is not getting younger. Did we have the strength, the patience, and the stamina to start again? A puppy is a major time commitment. But then what was

the alternative except to be a dead soul?

In the medieval Church Accidie ('spiritual sloth' or 'torpor') was considered a cardinal sin. The OED definition seems to me more accurate ~ 'black despair'. Similar, perhaps, to clinical depression, accidie cannot just be willed away. It robs the soul of vitality, the sufferer of inner peace.

Unsought into my slough of despond there came, from the Old Testament Book of Deuteronomy, a verse that had embedded itself in my mind half a century ago and had led me to become involved in the nascent Canadian pro-life movement ~ this is the verse: "Today I set before you life and death: choose life". If I was to choose life now, for whatever years remain to me, it dawned on me that my life had to include a dog.

Just as I began to make some preliminary inquiries of those wonderful people who breed Golden Retrievers, I had an unexpected phone call from Golden Rescue ~ could I drive to JFK airport in New York on the night of August 26th to meet a Turkish Airlines flight arriving from Istanbul carrying three rescue dogs? As it happens, I could not. But the next day, another call ~ could we foster one of the dogs arriving on that flight ~ an eight-month-old Golden flying under the name 'Dan Ackroyd'? Coincidence or providence? You tell me!

I hardly need relate the rest of the story. We got Dan Ackroyd #2636 on August 28th and tucked under my desk as I write these words is the aforesaid Dan Ackroyd, whose name has been changed to 'Jacob' (which means 'protected by God'). A dog who somehow made it from a crowded shelter in Istanbul,



Turkey, to a safe place under my desk in St. Thomas, Ontario, deserves that name I think. I hope that we are going to make Jacob as happy as his safe arrival has made us.






Winston #2261





We now use flight volunteers who are travelling on direct flights to bring our rescued Goldens to Toronto. Flight volunteers are allowed two to three Goldens per person on each flight. We are extremely grateful and appreciative of our flight volunteers who so generously help us out this way. If you are interested in adopting one of these precious souls, please fill in an online application and indicate that you would like an 'out-of-country' Golden. One of our volunteers will contact you and take it from there! Thank you for your interest in our Rescue Mission of Love. As long as there are Goldens out there who need us, we will try to come to their rescue ~ one Golden at a time! Goldie

Dear Goldie: What can you suggest to protect my Golden's pads from salt and cold? Baby it's cold out there! Adele's Dad


Dear Adele's Dad: Well it's that time of the year again ~ just plain ol' cold.

Sometimes we might not like it very much, but Goldens usually love being outside and you're right to want to protect Adele's pads from the ice and salt. First thing to consider is a good 'pawdicure' ~ keeping the fur between the paw pads short so that snowballs and ice don't collect there during your walk. If snow and ice do build up between her pads you might have to remove these a few times on a particularly snowy day in order to keep Adele comfy and moving forward. Also, there are lots of booties available in many styles. Yes, it does sometimes take a bit of persistence to get them on and it might take some convincing to get Adele to keep them on, but with a little love and some treats, you should win the battle and keep those paws frost free. And remember to always wash off salt and ice from her paws and check for any splits or cracks in the pads which may require additional attention. Good luck this winter. Adele will love you even more for keeping her tootsies toasty!

It's a hazard that can be very harmful if swallowed. So don't eat it and if your humans are reading this, they might be well advised to just skip this part of the decorating process. Be safe and put the tinsel away and be wary of any other tree ornaments that look like toys that could present a health hazard for your Golden. Lights and electrical cords can present hazards as well and plants like poinsettias and holly are poisonous for dogs, so don't eat those either. Also, you might see your humans do that kissing thing under the mistletoe, but guess what, it's poisonous for dogs also (the mistletoe, not the kissing). Chocolate seems to be the treat of choice for humans at this time of the year, but don't get carried away or too excited because you can't have any. Yep, it's really bad for dogs. Just 'cause they're eating it, doesn't mean you should. It can present some serious, sometimes life-threatening health issues. Humans: keep chocolate out of reach so your Golden is not tempted to see what all the fuss is about. 

Golden Rescue continues to grow and evolve...and we're looking for volunteers! Might that be you? We run solely with volunteers ~ a wonderfully dedicated group sharing a common vision to safeguard the wellbeing of every Golden in our care. Our work is hugely rewarding and we would love to hear from you. We currently have needs in a number of areas.

CASUAL OPPORTUNITIES

Events:

Bring your Golden or just yourself and help out at one of our many events throughout the year ~ all with the double goal of raising funds and building awareness for Golden Rescue. The events are fun and everyone ~ and we mean everyone ~ loves to talk to our volunteers about our sweet Goldens. You never have to ask for a donation ~ we simply have a 'Please Donate' sign and donation jar in full view.

Transport:

Eastern Ontario & Quebec

Transport help is always needed to move our Goldens from their past to their future new lives. To do this, volunteer drivers travel the province and beyond picking up our precious cargo from their previous homes, shelters, vet offices, airports, etc. and driving them to their foster families. Sometimes this trip is short and can be done by one person and other times the distance is greater, requiring volunteers to work as a relay team, picking up or dropping off at identified locations along the way. Obviously, this is a very important task. Drivers must have a valid driver's license and be willing to use their own car.

Home Visits:

Potential foster or adopting families require a home visit. You would visit these temporary

and permanent families and spend about 30 minutes engaging in conversation and asking some questions from the questionnaire we provide to you to guide the conversation. When you return home, you are asked to fill out the home visit form and email it to the volunteer who contacted you.

TEAM OPPORTUNITIES

Hotline Team Members

Golden Rescue has a hotline where individuals can leave messages regarding any aspect of the organization ~ from being interested in a Golden on the website to making a financial donation. Our mandate is to respond to all messages within a three to four-hour period. We are currently seeking two to three individuals who would be available to join our hotline team. You would be responsible for responding to all incoming messages and either assist the caller by answering their question or forward the caller's information, on a timely and accurate basis, to the appropriate volunteer. You will be provided with all the training and information needed to fulfill these responsibilities. Obviously, good communication skills are a must. This role is a great opportunity to learn about the entire Golden Rescue organization as you will be dealing with many different volunteers from many different teams. Estimated time **commitment:** approximately one week every six to seven weeks and about 30 minutes each day

Transport Team Back-Up

We need a passionate Golden lover on our transport team. You will arrange the transporting of Goldens from our extensive list of avid transport volunteers. The main requirement is frequently checking emails in order to ensure prompt service to our operations team. If you're interested, our transport team lead who would train and mentor you, would like to chat with you about the role. Estimated time commitment: 5-6 hours per month

Volunteer Coordinators

Volunteer Coordinators are vital members of the Golden Rescue team. They are responsible for the recruitment and coordination of volunteers, two legged and four legged, for our events. These events occur April to December and are important for fundraising and building awareness. It is our goal that each VC will have 3-4 events to manage during the year, which can be done remotely and involves mostly emails with some phone work starting about two months prior to the event. **Estimated time commitment:** 6-8 hours per event

Are You a Retired Educator or Active in Education?

We want to help elementary and secondary school students learn about the benefits of rescue ~ specifically Golden Rescue ~ and all that we do to give our precious Goldens a second chance at a better life. In order to make inroads into schools, we are looking for retired educators who can 'knock on the principal's door' or tap into school board and teacher networks to help schedule Golden Rescue presentations. Additionally, you would help develop age-appropriate presentations, deliver presentations and/or work with Golden Rescue's Education Team lead to find volunteer presenters. Estimated time commitment: roughly 10 hours per month and availability during school hours is ideal


